

# Things You Need To Know

## About White Cedar Horse Camp and Trailhead

### HORSES

It's **OKAY** for your horse to be:

- In a corral
- In your trailer
- Being ridden by you
- Temporarily tied to a hitching post



It's **NOT OKAY** for your horse to be:

- In the playground area for any reason
- Tied to a highline in the campground
- Tied to any tree in the campground
- Inside an electric fence outside the corral

The fine for damage to any tree is a minimum of \$125



### WATER

**We have a limited reservoir here—please don't waste water!**

It's **OKAY** to water your horse:

- At designated watering stations in campground
- Along the trail at stream crossings.

It's **NOT OKAY**

- To create paths to the creek
- To take water away from the campground

### CAMPERS

- All vehicles must be parked on the parking spur  
Do not park along the road
- Quiet hours are 10 PM to 6 AM
- Check out time –1 PM
- Clean your campsite before you leave
- Please fill any holes dug by your horses



#### **How Do You Know What Size Campsite You Need?**

- All of your horses must fit inside the corral. No high lines, tethers or electric fence are permitted outside the corral.
- Single corrals are designed to accommodate 2 untied horses-- maximum is 4 horses per corral.
- All of your vehicles must fit on the graveled parking spur-- no parking along the road.
- All of your gear must be contained within the designated site-- no spreading into the woods.

If you don't fit on the site, you may need a double site or two sites. If campsites here are not available, try the undeveloped campsites along Lions Den road.

No exceptions to any of these policies. Violators will be asked to leave the campground-- no refund.
